ICONIC PLAYERS, COACHES & MOMENTS

- In 1971, Head Coach Vince Dooley takes home the trophy against his little brother, North Carolina's head coach, Bill Dooley, in a low-scoring game. This bowl game was named the 'Dooley Bowl'.

- Quarterback, Wayne Johnson, usually known for his run game, threw a surprising 227 yards with 3 touchdowns in 1989. He took the Bulldogs to victory against Michigan State.
- A monumental moment for the Georgia Bulldogs and their Head Coach Vince Dooley when he wins his final game of his coaching career in 1989. This is the same place he ended his playing career years prior at the Gator Bowl.
- In the 2016 game, wide receiver, Terry Godwin, was awarded MVP after scoring a touchdown and throwing a surprising 44-yard touchdown to Malcolm Mitchell.
