
ICONIC PLAYERS, COACHES & MOMENTS

- The 1957 game is still the lowest scoring game in Gator Bowl History at 3-0.
- In the 1966 game, Dewey Warren passed for 244 yards to help seal the win over the Orange.
- The 1969 game was a close one with the Vols losing to the Gators 14-13. Curt Watson ran for 121 yards, but it was not enough to defeat the Gators.




Bobby Scott, 1969

 The 1973 game was the first Gator Bowl to be played at night. MVP winner, Haskel Stanback, put up two touchdowns of his own, but it was not enough to win the game against the Red Raiders.

 The 1994 Outback Steakhouse Gator Bowl was played in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. It was a team effort all around as the Vols won 45-23. James Stewart and Peyton Manning worked hard on offense and the defense took it the rest of the way.





 In the 2015 Gator Bowl, Jalen Hurd ran for 122 yards and two scores. Joshua Dobbs threw for 129 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for 76 yards and two more scores. The Vols defeated the Hawkeyes 45-28.

 The 2020 game was the 75th anniversary of the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl. Tennessee had a comeback victory against the Hoosiers. They put up 14 points in the final quarter to win it 14-13.
